## SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT

- 1. Leftover food and vegetable waste from the canteen are gathered and repurposed for a biogas facility.
- 2. The campus has been designated as a plastic-free zone, yet any minimal plastic waste produced is gathered and sold to vendors for recycling.
- 3. Used batteries are sold to vendors for recycling purposes.
- 4. Collecting solid waste like metal scraps and paper waste at a common point and selling them to vendors every three months or as needed is a practical approach to managing waste and generating some income. It promotes cleanliness and environmental sustainability while also contributing to the local economy.
- 5. Encouraging students and faculty to use digital platforms to avoid the usage papers including digital notes and assignment, online textbooks and resources, electronic forms and survey, electronic signature, dual sided printing, document scanning and electronic communication.
